The 2007 Annual Conference Report

Chris and I were privileged to attend our Annual Conference in Houston

from September 26- 30. The theme was "Contemplative Vision: Awakening to Beauty, Truth and Goodness" based on Phillipians 4:8-9. Two hundred of us were warmly welcomed Wednesday evening by Timothy Kooock who was the chairman of this deeply spiritual Conference, Gail Fitzpatrick-Hopler and Fr. Thomas Keating.

Each morning began with 30 minutes of Centering Prayer at 7:15 and, following a hearty Texas breakfast (for example 5 pieces of bacon, a huge round sausage, eggs, etc.), we continued the Visioning process we began last year.

The well thought out input from Chapters was presented and we spent all day Thursday synthesizing and refining those ideas. It was quite a challenge, but we were able to finalize a document that will be presented to the Board of Trustees. We had Centering Prayer before lunch and dinner each day and there was also time to go to the Bookstore and Information Tables. On Thursday evening we had Regional meetings and there were 8 people from California, one from Hawaii and one from Arizona in our group. We shared ideas and information and it was especially good to get to know others from L.A. and northern California.

On Friday we had a presentation by Fr. Richard Rohr who gave a preview of his remarks on the topic of Beauty, Truth and Goodness. In the afternoon we had the Annual Business meeting which included ten reports from key CO teams. That evening four hundred and eight attendees joined us for the Enrichment Weekend to hear in-depth presentations from Frs. Rohr and Keating. It was awesome to pray in silence with hundreds of people and then engage in hundreds of lively conversations. Friday evening began with a Sacred Sound Musician who played ancient singing bowls of various sizes and the vibratory sounds were mesmerizing.

This was followed by a deeply moving Taize Prayer Service and Chris and I lingered there in the beauty and silence. Saturday belonged to Fr. Richard Rohr and Fr. Thomas Keating. Each spoke for an hour both in the morning and in the afternoon and they conveyed so much “Beauty, Truth and Goodness.” After Fr. Keating finished speaking everyone was so moved that no one clapped—it was a beautiful silence. We hope to hold a meeting in the future to share what we heard. That evening we had a festive banquet and a deeply spiritual concert by a group called Conspirare who has been nominated for two Grammy Awards. Their appearance was made possible by Tim Kooch, his family and other generous donors.

Sunday began with a Roman Catholic Liturgy, more sacred sound music and a final presentation and closing blessing by Fr. Keating. By afternoon most everyone had left and there was a different kind of silence in the hotel. Our time in Houston is etched in our hearts and we are deeply grateful for each and every moment.

Roadmap Survey Results

On May 19th, 2007 CONSD held a Visioning Day. On that day over twenty members of CONSD spent the day identifying the challenges, needs, issues, and opportunities that lie ahead which, if addressed, would achieve our goal of bringing CONSD’s Vision and Mission Statements and Core Values into the lives of our membership. Of the many wonderful ideas that came forward, the following seven were identified by the group as having the top priority: Centering Prayer groups, Introductory Programs/Special Events, Outreach, Spiritual Directors, local retreat center, help for experienced centering prayer practitioners to deepen their practice, and fund raising. These seven potential areas for action and their respective sub-areas for action became our “Preliminary Roadmap for Action.” A survey that asked the entire membership to prioritize these seven areas of need and their sub-areas was posted on our website. Our members were notified that the survey had been posted and they were encouraged to give us their priorities. The results of the survey indicate that our Servant Leadership Team should focus its energy on establishing Centering Prayer groups in areas of North County where none exist and provide more spiritually enriching events, as well as programs, such as the Living Flame that will help experienced practitioners to deepen their practice.

Since the results of the survey were determined we have held Introductory Programs in Murietta and Escondido and we have been asked to make an informational presentation about Centering Prayer to the parishioners of St Thomas More Catholic Church in Vista/Oceanside and Trinity Episcopal Church in Escondido in the immediate future. All of these locations were areas in which we do not currently have Centering Prayer groups. We have begun to poll the membership regarding their interest in the Living Flame program. At this time twenty have expressed an interest. A minimum of twenty five are needed to bring this seven month, one time a month, program to our area. This program was described in our last newsletter and again in this newsletter. Finally, we are also exploring the feasibility of holding a three day weekend retreat some time next year at the Prince of Peace Abbey or Mission San Luis Rey both of which are in Oceanside. As the Servant Leadership Team accomplishes these three top action area priorities it will address the next three areas of need from the list of seven.

A Whirlwind of Introductory Programs

We have been blessed! Contemplative Outreach North San Diego has managed to give three introductory workshops in sixteen days! The first was held at the Community House in Murrieta on Saturday, September 22. Seven people attended. Bob Dudley served as both the contact person and the team leader in charge of making the whole thing happen. He did a great job. Kristin Andersen made her very successful maiden voyage as a presenter, and Chris Hagen did his usual splendid job as the co-presenter. Kristin is already leading a prayer group in the area, and will also facilitate the continuing sessions.

The second workshop was held on Saturday, October 6 at Rancho Bernardo Community Presbyterian Church for a group of 19. Cary Boyll, who has already begun leading a prayer group there, did a wonderful job as contact person. Chris Hagen presented once again, and this time Alicia Annas, another first-time presenter, did an excellent job of accompanying him. Evie McGreevy will join Cary in facilitating the continuing sessions.

Our third introductory workshop was given in a different format. We held two meetings on subsequent Monday afternoons, October 8 and 15 from 4-6 p.m. at the United Methodist Church of Escondido. Linda Dollins has served as the contact person for this workshop, which 13 people attended. Becky Crowley presented on both evenings, and Susan Siciliano and our stalwart Chris Hagen, who has not complained at being overworked, each accompanied her on one of the evenings. Mary Williams, will facilitate the continuing sessions. It has been a wonderful experience to see how our community has gathered to help and be a part of these workshops. Each one has been a lovely group of new attendees, presenters, facilitators, and other contemplatives who have come to be refreshed in their practice and lend a hand as well.

Prison Outreach

The Contemplative Outreach ministry for sharing the practice of Centering Prayer in prisons started about ten years ago in the Texas and California prisons under the leadership of Fred Eckart. A small group of volunteers from COSD (Pauline Rappel, Martha McGowan and Marlene Rodgers) started offering instruction in Lectio Divina and Centering Prayer about four years ago at the invitation of Chaplain Bery and are still active today at the federal immigration prison located in Otay Mesa. Father Keating also visited the prison and met with the detainees just over a year ago. These prisoners are awaiting the outcome of legal proceedings related to their residency in the U. S. Most have committed no crimes against persons or property. They come from all nations and faiths.

I remember reading an article about this prison ministry in a COSD newsletter a short time after I started centering. The article asked for more volunteers with an established practice of centering prayer.

When I retired last year, I saw another article on the subject and again felt drawn to this

service as the scripture quote, "...I was in prison and you visited me..." (Mt 25:36) ran through my mind over and over. I talked with Marlene and then contacted Chaplain Bery. After filling out paperwork and attending a one-day training session, I observed Pauline Rappel for several weeks as she conducted sessions in Lectio Divina and Centering Prayer. I was touched by how much these detainees appreciated our presence that witnessed our concern for them. Even more moving was the depth of their understanding of the healing effect of the practice and its help in their daily lives while in prison and when they returned to their homes.

When I began facilitating groups on my own, I was nervous about language and cultural differences as well as possible behavior issues but I was finally able to "let go and let God." Just like centering prayer, I try to show

up regularly with some amount of preparation but then let the group go where the Spirit moves it. Sometimes no one wants to come and other times there are almost too many to fit in a room. Sometimes I do all the talking with one of the prisoners translating into Spanish for me. Other times, the group selects the scripture and shares their own faith experiences in English and/or Spanish. I try to share with them the very simple practice of spending time with God in prayerful scripture reading and silence as a way of becoming better friends with God and deepening their trust in His loving presence in our daily lives.

Over and over again, I hear them say that God brought them into this prison to give them a chance to spend time renewing their faith in God and making them rethink the choices they have made in their lives. But as Chaplain Bery reminds me, we are just the servants, sowing seeds that we will not personally see take root, but trust the Spirit to do the work.

"Sacred Rest" Retreat

Soothing calm...welcomed quiet...and prayerful peace... marked the beginning, middle, and end of the half day retreat for 61 contemplative companions on Saturday August 25, at the Lutheran Church of the Incarnation in Rancho Bernardo. The memorable morning began with quiet fellowship and abundant refreshments in an atmosphere that included a symbolic blue-green stream, reminding us of being beside the "still waters" of the 23rd Psalm, with our peaceful and promising Lord at the headwaters. When we stepped into the room, our spirits began to be renewed and our souls restored.

Retreatants were led in an opening prayer by Evie McGreevey, invoking the divine mystery and blessings of restful awareness that we experience through our practice of Centering Prayer. With Evie's skillful guidance, our sacred rest evolved and deepened throughout the morning, and hopefully remained with us beyond that morning and is evidenced in the fruits of our prayer. We heard and trusted the invitation of Christ quoted from the Bible "come to me all of you who are heavily laden and I will give you rest" and we began to feel rested. We surrendered, or at minimum we suspended our worldly burdens in a series of centering prayer "sits", and welcomed the Lord through our individual and collective consent and intention. As the morning unfolded, we participated in a variety of restful activities that included embracing centering prayer; engaging in Tai Chi movements using our bodies as well as our minds and spirits; listening to and relaxing in calming music; and ending the retreat with lovely chants led by Avril Bland.

Words of wisdom were both spoken and printed, and available on the walls for all to read and ponder during scheduled silent breaks throughout the morning. We were called on to relax, and, as Father Thomas Keating tells us, to surrender to the moment that holds deep rest, bringing balance and healing. We were presented with many of God's gifts this morning and they were there for our taking, to be experienced with all of our senses. We saw, heard, felt, tasted, smelled, and touched the wonder of the Lord that is available for our enjoyment at any moment, in every day. We often forget or are unable to enjoy the presence of the Lord because of the pressing demands of the world. Many symbols, lovely décor and candles, soothing music and chants, words of wisdom, good food, and active participation helped us receive and take in the abundant gifts of God this day.

Grateful thanks to Evie for her energizing spirit, the careful planning, and enthusiastic presentation of varied paths that guided us, helping us surrender our burdens, and for that time to rest in the inner stillness and peace that is our Lord. "He will know us"... by the fruits of our own spirit, which are nurtured by these fine retreats. Sincere thanks also to all the wonderful people of St. Bart's centering prayer group whose work and goods made this memorable day possible. Thanks also to Sue and Chris and all centering prayer group leaders for their unselfish continuing support that sustains us.

LIVING FLAME PROGRAM IN 2008!!!!!!??????

In our last Newsletter we provided information on the Living Flame 1 Program presented by Contemplative Outreach, Ltd. This spiritually enriching Program is designed to be experiential as well as informational giving participants the opportunity to evaluate, validate and share their own experience of Centering Prayer in the context of community. The Program consists of seven sessions, one session per month, from 9:00AM to 4:00 PM and consistent attendance is essential. . The sessions are as follows: Lectio Divina, Refinement of the Centering Prayer Practice, Formation of the False Self, The False Self in Action, Divine Therapy, Night of Sense and the Welcoming Prayer. Even though our Chapter has previously had a few of these presentations it is important to note that, since

that time, our practice has grown and deepened and we will hear and understand these presentations at a substantially different level.

In order to cover the costs of this Program we would need at least 25 people. The estimated total cost per person would be approximately \$150.00 and payment would need to be made in advance. We have been told recently that we could offer this Program in the **FALL OF 2008** and we need at least 10 more people to insure meeting our costs.. Q and A with Fr. Keating

Question: I find this practice gets me nowhere. Is it good to try to make the faculties a blank?

Fr. Keating: "Please don't try to make your faculties a blank. There should always be a gentle, spiritual activity present, expressed either by thinking the sacred word or by the simple awareness that you are present to God. The experience of emptiness is the presence of your intention in a very subtle way. You cannot maintain that experience of emptiness unless your intention is at work. It may seem like no work because it is so simple. At the same time, this method of prayer takes time to learn and you need not worry about experiencing what you may interpret as a blank once in a while. This prayer is a way of resting in God. If you notice that you have a blank, that's a thought; merely return to the sacred word."

Encinitas Prayer Group #2

Our prayer group is an evolving, dynamic ecumenical group. In the beginning, 1998, Father Keating was in San Diego for a week at a gathering that included a focus on Centering Prayer. There were 6-week follow-up sessions at Mission San Luis Rey that were facilitated by Reverend Harry Starbuck, retired United Methodist Minister. A Centering Prayer group led by Rev. Starbuck was formed following those sessions. That group met in the Starbuck's home in Carlsbad.

In April 2000 an introductory workshop was held at San Dieguito United Methodist Church in Encinitas and the 6-week follow-up sessions, led by Rev. Starbuck, were held at the Church. Another prayer group, which became known as Encinitas Prayer Group #2, was formed by some of the people who attended the workshop. Rev. Starbuck and his wife, Lollie, were the facilitators of this prayer group also. Prayer Group #2 met at the Methodist Church until February 2002 when it began meeting at the home of Ann and Mike King. Also in 2002, the Prayer Group from Carlsbad decided to join Encinitas Prayer Group 2. In 2004 Harry and Lollie moved to Northern California and Ann and Mike King and Susan Siciliano took on the role of facilitators of the group.

We have been blessed with the spiritual enrichment coming from the various Christian Church traditions brought by the members of our group. The Christian churches represented have included a local Community Christian Church, Episcopal, Presbyterian, Roman Catholic, and United Methodist. During our time together we have viewed all of Father Keating's tapes on Centering Prayer, read and discussed several books on Centering Prayer, and listened to tapes from Contemplative Life practitioners, all followed by a time of reflection and discussion. We have at times practiced Lectio Divina. We have met continuously since 2000. During that time we have shared joys and sorrows. We have witnessed personal spiritual growth and life changes due to the power of the Centering Prayer. And we rejoice that other Centering Groups have been formed by members of our Prayer Group who moved on to other areas.

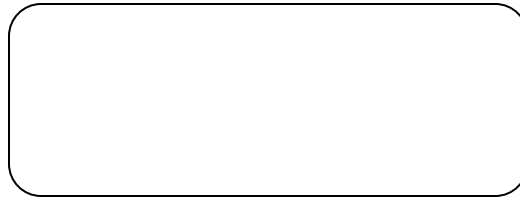
